




By the end of the 2023-2024 school year, 50% of students will score proficient or better on the ELA and Math state assessments, or will demonstrate 1.5 years worth of growth annually on the Renaissance STAR test for ELA and Math.

By 2024, the school will create and maintain a comprehensive plan for engaging, students, parents and community partners resulting in an overall attendance percentage of 93% and a decrease in suspensions by 10% and office referrals by 20%.


By the end of 2024, the school will provide Career Based Intervention, Career Technical Education Pathways, Industry Credential Opportunities, and Work Based Learning Experiences as a way for at least 80% of graduating students to earn the Ohio Means Jobs Readiness Seal, resulting in an increase of 5% for the overall Graduation Rate.

Achievement Component

The Achievement component, previously called the High School Test Passage Rate component, represents the number of students who meet applicable criteria on assessments that are required for graduation.

Progress

The Progress component looks closely at the growth all students are making during the school year.

Gap Closing

This component shows how well schools are improving or meeting the performance expectations for all students in English language arts, math, graduation, and English language proficiency.

The Graduation Rate component looks at the percent of students who are successfully finishing high school with a diploma in four, five, six, seven or eight years.
