OMJ Readiness Seal



Did you know that 85% of career success comes from well-developed soft skills (such as punctuality, work ethic, professionalism, global fluency, and communication)?

Demonstration of these skills is a large part of earning the OMJ Readiness Seal. By earning this seal, students have demonstrated proficiency in 14 different professional skills as identified by potential employers.

In April, students at CASTLE will have the chance to compete in the school-wide Amazing Shake to see who has the best soft skills. The winner will move on to a state-wide competition.

Mentors within the school, workplace, and community attest to these skills.

One of the best ways to demonstrate being ready for the day is to be on time for school. Breakfast is served at 7:45am and school starts at 8:00am. Any student who arrives after 8:15am is marked "tardy". Why does this matter? Chronic absenteeism, regardless of reason, is measured in hours. After so many hours, students need to be put on an Attendance Intervention Plan as a step to prevent filing for truancy.
